Active Shooter	The objective of this regional presentation is to serve as a guideline for everyone on how to react to an active shooter situation.
Adult-Pediatric FA/CPR/AED Skills Assessment	The First Aid/CPR/AED blended learning courses prepare participants to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies and to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies involving adults, children and infants. Prerequisite: participants must complete the online portion prior to May 23rd to attend this skills assessment.
Bulk Distribution Operations	The purpose of this course is to prepare participants for the tasks and responsibilities in setting up, operating and supporting Bulk Distribution on a local response and disaster relief operation.
Care Assistant Fundamentals Health Services Evaluator Training	This course is for those intending to become authorized Health Services Evaluators to administer the proctored Skills Test for Care Assistant Fundamentals, which is a course designed to prepare disaster responders and partners to safely assist people with Disabilities and other Access and Functional needs access and utilize Red Cross facilities and services while promoting the independence of the clients served.
Care Assistant Fundamentals Skills Lab	This is the proctored skills test portion of the basic level, modular online course featuring face-to-face Skills Testing. It is designed to train disaster responders and partners to assist people with Disabilities and other Access and Functional Needs with the basic Activities of Daily Living. Prerequisite: Completion of the 5 online modules and objectives assessments
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Collaborating Essentials	Collaborating Essentials is a basic level, instructor-led course designed to promote and support collaboration at the Red Cross. Participants will engage in discussions and scenarios to determine the different skills and behaviors required for building and maintaining internal and external relationships. The course emphasizes the role that collaboration plays in the successful delivery of disaster services.
Concept of Operations	In this workshop we will explore the Disaster Cycle Services Concept of Operations which was published November 2014. As part of that discussion we will delve into further detail on ICS, incident action planning, and situation reporting. The entire workshop will offer an insight into how the meetings/reporting/products are developed and distributed on a disaster. It is highly recommended that you take the ICS workshop prior to this workshop.
DAT Supervisor Workshop	The purpose of this workshop is to prepare participants for the tasks and responsibilities for prospective DAT Leads and Captains. Tabletop exercises will simulate various situations that they may encounter in the field with open discussions and problem solving.
Disaster Action Team Trainee Workshop	This course is the introduction to the Disaster Action Team and will introduce you to a DAT call. Individuals will learn about Hot and Cold Calls and how to go on scene with their DAT Team. This course will help you learn about the disaster environment and help you learn what to expect when you respond to a local disaster. Individuals are encouraged to take the DAT Interviewing Skills in the afternoon.

Disaster Frontline Supervisor & Simulation	Disaster Frontline Supervisor (DFS) is an instructor-led, basic level course. The Disaster Frontline Supervisor Handbook provides disaster relief operations supervisors with tools that support their success. The handbook is for use on operations and in the classroom. You will receive a link to the handbook to use in the course. Disaster Frontline Supervisor Simulation (DFSS) is an instructor-led, basic level course. The simulation builds on the information presented in the Disaster Frontline Supervisor (DFS) course. The simulation provides participants an opportunity to practice key supervisory skills and use the Disaster Frontline Supervisor Handbook as a resource .
Disaster Mental Health Fundamentals	The purpose of the course is to prepare licensed mental health professionals to provide for and respond to the psychological needs of people throughout the disaster cycle of preparedness, response and recovery.
Disaster Public Affairs for National Relief Operations	Curious about Public Affairs? Want to learn more about sharing the Red Cross Story? Nervous about interviews and looking for tips? Curious about ways to volunteer with the Public Affairs Team? Disaster Public Affairs For National Relief Operations is a 6 – 7 hour Red Cross sanctioned class on disaster public affairs – the National Response. This work shop will explain how we organize to do public affairs for a national disaster, how we tell our story, and discussing writing techniques, photo and video skills, social engagement techniques, and related matters.
Disaster Response	The purpose of the Disaster Response Management Simulation (DRMS) is to prepare Red Cross disaster workers to function
Disaster Response Management Simulation Day 2	The purpose of the Disaster Response Management Simulation (DRMS) is to prepare Red Cross disaster workers to function effectively as managers and leaders on a district level or larger relief operation within a region, state or division. To do this, the simulation allows participants to experience key elements of a disaster operation from preparedness capabilities to an after action analysis of the incident.
DST Tech Help	OMG! No cell service! Learn how to manage communications challenges in the midst of technology challenges.
ERV: Ready Set Roll (Off Site)	As a prospective ERV driver, you must be aware that there are a number of requirements. It is your responsibility to make sure these are taken care of (some are actually done by staff), but you need to make sure your records are accurate. The requirements are listed below with some guidance to help you. You must be able to show your driver's license before you can take the road test and have completed the Defensive Driving course. The other requirements can be done either before the class or after, but you cannot be authorized until all are completed. The ERV: Ready, Set, Roll course is done in three parts: Self-study, Vehicle Orientation (classroom), and Road Test. You must: Be 21 years of age; Have a valid driver's license; Have completed the online Safe Food Handling course; Have completed the Defensive Driving course; Current certifications in First Aid and CPR •Must be on your Red Cross training record; Also, there are a number of physical capacity requirements for Feeding staff, including ERV drivers. ERV drivers don't just drive, so it is important that you are able to load, feed, clean, etc. Please be honest in your self- assessment regarding your capacity to perform these tasks. I can speak from personal experience that these are not unusual expectations for ERV drivers. If you cannot perform these activities, you may not want to take the course. Physical capacity; Lift/carry 50 lbs multiple times per shift(with a partner); Work in extreme heat and/or humidity; Stand for 2 hr periods • Work outdoors in inclement weather; Sit for 2 hr periods • Work in extreme cold; Walk on uneven terrain • Able to step up/down 18 inches; Walk for 2 miles during a shift • Speak clearly on phone and in person; Bend or stoop multiple times during a shift. Drive in day time and at night; Climb 2 or more flights of stairs
Facilitative Leadership Skills for Mobilizing the Community	The purpose of this course is to prepare participants to practice effective facilitative leadership skills when mobilizing the community to meet client and community disaster-related needs.

Financial And Statistical Information Management	What do you need to know to start an operation in terms of keeping track of financial and statistical information? What tools exist to help you collect the information? This workshop will explore the world of FSI and the 5266. Prerequisite: 5266 Fundamentals (online).
Forklift Fundamentals Module 2 (Off Site)	Forklift Fundamentals is a blended learning, basic level course consisting of a web-based module and an instructor-led module. Module 1 is a web-based, OSHA approved forklift training provided to the American Red Cross Disaster Cycle Services through a licensing agreement with Vivid Learning Systems. Participants will be required to complete a 50 question assessment at the end of this module and pass it with a score of 80% or higher in order to receive their certificate of completion and attend Module 2. Module 2 is a live trainer led course that uses the Module 1 content to deliver hands-on training, including a forklift inspection and operator driving test. These courses meet the requirements to work in Red Cross facilities that are managed by National Headquarters or regions on a day to day basis, or one that is opened to support a disaster relief operation on a temporary basis. As the Red Cross pays a fee for each participant who takes Module 1, it is important that only those workers who qualify for and are in Logistics Warehousing or Mass Care Bulk Distribution be given access to the course. Prerequisite: you must complete the online module 1 prior to attending this session.
Foundations of Disaster Fundraising	This course reviews the policies, guidelines and practices of Red Cross fundraising activities during a disaster.

Fundamentals of Disaster Assessment Module II	This course will give an update on Disaster Assessment and walk through changes and check for understanding regarding assessments and technological components of RC View, Survey 123 and other options for Disaster Assessment. Pre-requisite: Disaster Assessment Fundamentals, Fundamentals of Disaster Assessment Module 1 online.

Government Operations Fundamentals	Government Operations Fundamentals is a basic level, instructor-led course that introduces the roles, responsibilities and tasks of the Red Cross government liaison. The purpose of this course is to prepare participants to work collaboratively with emergency management and other Red Cross partners throughout the disaster cycle to ensure a coordinated response that results in effective service delivery.
In-Kind Donations on Disaster Relief Operations Fundamentals	In-Kind Donations on Disaster Relief Operations Fundamentals is a basic level, instructor-led course that introduces the responsibilities and tasks of an In-Kind Donations responder working in Logistics operations on a disaster relief operation. Participants engage in activities and scenarios that Red Cross Supply responders typically encounter when working on a Red Cross disaster relief operation. Prerequisite: Logistics: An Overview
Integrated Care and Condolence Team Fundamentals	Integrated Care Condolence Team Fundamentals supports the standards and procedures and highlights the unique aspects of working as a team to provide services to families and friends of missing, injured and deceased loved ones.
Life, Safety, Asset Protection Workshop	The purpose of this workshop is to prepare participants for the tasks and responsibilities for Life Safety and Asset Protection. This is a regional overview and not a Nationally recognized course.
Local Deployment Training	This is a supplemental overview with some of the finer points of the deployment process for first time or prospective volunteers who wish to deploy nationally.
Logistics: An Overview	Logistics: An Overview is an instructor-led, basic level course designed to give participants an overview of the Logistics group and the activities associated with it. Participants will learn about the skills, abilities and knowledge needed by Logistics workers and how they can become involved in their local chapter.

Mass Care Management	The Mass Care Management-2017 course is an advanced level, instructor-led course designed to inform participants how to successfully manage Mass Care on a regional, divisional or national level disaster operation. The course describes the advanced planning process. This course clarifies roles and responsibilities between mass care leadership positions operating between district and disaster operations positions. It also describes the newly revised advanced operational planning process and the expectations of mass care workers in the planning process.
NSS Reports and Data Management	The purpose of the course is to prepare participants to manage shelter and agency information in the NSS, and to produce reports for planning and operational purposes.
Pillowcase Project: Module 2	This course prepares you to be a Pillowcase Project presenter, a preparedness education program for children in grades 3-5, which teaches students about personal and family preparedness, local hazards, and basic coping skills. Generally given as a 60 minute presentation by Red Cross volunteers, the program leads students through a learn, practice, share framework to engage them in disaster preparedness. Students receive a sturdy pillowcase upon completion of the program in which they are encouraged to build their personal emergency supplies kit. Presentations are customized to focus on a hazard that is important and relevant to the local community. Prerequisite: Pillowcase Project Module 1 in EDGE.
PMDP: Collaboration Across Organizational Teams	The People Manager Development Program (PMDP) is designed to improve managerial effectiveness in our leaders. In an ever-changing environment, you as a leader are being asked to do more with less within either a traditional or matrix management structure. This course focuses on how fostering collaboration can increase team satisfaction and yield higher financial results, regardless of structure. Attention will be spent on how to influence without authority and exploring your accountability and collaboration as a leader.
PMDP: Managing in the Red Cross Culture	The People Manager Development Program (PMDP) is designed to improve managerial effectiveness in our leaders. This course connects you as a leader to the Red Cross culture, highlighting the unique partnership between your paid employees and volunteers. Focus will be on internalizing the Red Cross values through discussion and assessment, examining what motivates paid staff and volunteers, and discovering how your leadership role can impact performance, customer satisfaction and overall results.
PMDP: Power Hour - Building Trust	The People Manager Development Program (PMDP) is designed to improve managerial effectiveness in our leaders. Participants will explore key guidelines and address a trust issue in the fictional team. Then, they will plan how to apply their learning in order to build trust within their own teams.
Preparedness Workshop	The purpose of this workshop is to prepare participants for the tasks and responsibilities for Preparedness events. The will give participants an overview on giving presentations, hosting events and info booths and other preparedness functions.
Psychological First Aid	Psychological First Aid is a basic level, instructor-led course. It provides a framework for understanding the factors that affect stress responses in disaster relief workers and the clients they serve. Participants engage in practice exercises and complete a self-review questionnaire.
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RC View Map Writing Fundamentals Day 1	RC View Map Writing Fundamentals is a 2-day instructor-led training course. Creating and editing maps is a critical skill for Disaster Cycle Services (DCS) and other Red Cross lines of business, and one that involves the execution of complex technical and analytical tasks. Instruction is reinforced with hands-on activities that allow participants to gain skill, practice and build maps that they will use in their regions.

RC View Map Writing Fundamentals Day 2	RC View Map Writing Fundamentals is a 2-day instructor-led training course. Creating and editing maps is a critical skill for Disaster Cycle Services (DCS) and other Red Cross lines of business, and one that involves the execution of complex technical and analytical tasks. Instruction is reinforced with hands-on activities that allow participants to gain skill, practice and build maps that they will use in their regions.
Regional Case Work Follow Up	The purpose of this workshop is to prepare participants for the tasks and responsibilities for prospective Follow Up team members. Tabletop exercises will simulate various situations that they may encounter with casework follow up with open discussions and problem solving.
Responding Safely to Utility Emergencies	Wires down or the smell of gas near you? What you need to do to respond safely to utility emergencies. Basic information of properties of gas and electricity, safe distances and what to do and not do around a utility emergency for emergency workers. This is a presentation by our partners at PG&E.
Saturday Evening Social	
Service Delivery Site Management	Service Delivery Site Management is an instructor-led, advanced level course designed to give the participants the knowledge and skills needed to run a service delivery site during a disaster. This course includes lecture, table group exercises, and a half-day simulation of a disaster to test the participants' knowledge of opening, maintaining and closing a service delivery site.
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Sexual Assault/Human Trafficking Presentation	A presentation by Stand Up Placer to raise awareness of sexual assault and human trafficking issues in and around our community.
Shelter Fundamentals	The revised Shelter Fundamentals is a basic level course that introduces the guidelines and procedures for setting up, running and closing a shelter during a disaster. Referencing shelter checklists, participants will work on a case study that takes them through four of the six phases of the Sheltering Process: Resourcing, Opening, Operating and Closing.
Shelter Management	The purpose of this course is to prepare participants to perform the roles, responsibilities and tasks of a shelter manager in a Red Cross shelter.
Shelter Operations Stimulation	The purpose of this simulation is to enable participants to simulate roles and gain sheltering experience using the content presented in the Shelter Fundamentals course. Participants need to take Shelter Fundamentals online previous to the class
Staff Services Fundamentals	Staff Services Fundamentals is a basic level, instructor-led course that is designed to inform participants how to successfully complete Staff Services tasks on a disaster operation and provide anticipatory customer service and support to assigned disaster workers. The primary focus of this course is directed toward regional staff but also provides the tools to support a disaster operation.
Staff Wellness	This course is designed to introduce the Staff Wellness Standards and Procedures and to prepare Staff Wellness Health Reviewers and responders to accomplish Staff Wellness tasks.
Supply Fundamentals	Supply Fundamentals is a basic level, instructor-led course that introduces the responsibilities and tasks of a Supply responder working in Logistics operations. Participants engage in activities and scenarios that Red Cross Supply responders typically encounter when working on a Red Cross disaster relief operation.

Supporting Volunteers and Managing Teams	Supporting Volunteers and Managing Teams is a basic level, instructor led course designed to benefit those who work with or supervise volunteers. It is designed to benefit those who are new to working with volunteers as well as those who have previous experience. It will present opportunities to raise self-awareness about what you are doing well as well as the positive changes you can make to enhance your success as a supervisor of volunteers.
Volunteer Services Help with VCN, EDGE, SABA	The purpose of this session is to provide help to volunteers in utilizing the various Red Cross tools and databases.
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WiFi Garden	Use this time to do online training in the WiFi Garden where there will be "Gardeners" available to help you with EDGE/LMS, FEMA Online, Basic Food Safety and other online courses, or Volunteer Connection.
