

Title	Description
Concept of Operations	In this workshop we will explore the Disaster Cycle Services Concept of Operations which was published November 2014. As part of that discussion we will delve into further detail on ICS, incident action planning, and situation reporting. The entire workshop will offer an insight into how the meetings/reporting/products are developed and distributed on a disaster. It is highly recommended that you take the ICS workshop prior to this workshop.
DAT Workshop - Phase 1	This Workshop is designed to give each participant the ability to complete all of the required EMBARC courses on-line with assistance from trained DAT Members and Captains. This is the beginning class to ensure that they are prepared to continue their training both on-line and in the field. For NEC North Volunteers, this class qualifies them to begin to schedule shifts through DCSOPs to respond to DAT calls.
DAT Workshop - Phase 2	This Workshop is designed to give each participant the ability to complete all of the required EMBARC courses on-line with assistance from trained DAT Members and Captains. There will also be supplemental activities to enhance their learning and prepare them for quick advancement to DAT members. We will cover all aspects of DAT policy and procedure for our territory. This will also prepare those volunteers who wish to apply to work on the Regional Casework Follow-up Team. This class takes them through the trainee phase to complete all training required to promote to member after completing DAT experiences in the field.
Feeding Fundamentals	This course is a a basic level course that will be instructor led. The course introduces the tasks and responsibilities of feeding workers during a disaster operation.
First Aid/CPR Traditional Classroom	This is the traditional all-inclusive course. The course teaches participants how to perform First Aid, CPR and will certify individuals for two years. No prerequisites are required.
Health Services Workshop	This workshop is designed for nurses, health services, and public health nurses. The workshop will have hands on training and setting up health services in a shelter demonstration. The workshop will create a scenario for DHS volunteers and county PHN partners.

Logistics: An Overview	Logistics: An Overview is an instructor-led, basic level course designed to give participants an overview of the Logistics group and the activities associated with it. Participants will learn about the skills, abilities and knowledge needed by Logistics workers and how they can become involved in their local chapter.
Pillowcase Project Fundamentals - Module 2	The Pillowcase Project is a preparedness education program for children in grades 3-5, which teaches students about personal and family preparedness, local hazards, and basic coping skills. Generally given as a 60 minute presentation by Red Cross volunteers, the program leads students through a learn, practice, share framework to engage them in disaster preparedness. Students receive a sturdy pillowcase upon completion of the program in which they are encouraged to build their personal emergency supplies kit. Presentations are customized to focus on a hazard that is important and relevant to the local community. Completion of this course is required to become an authorized Pillowcase Presenter. Prerequisite Required Pillowcase Project Fundamentals - Module 1 Web Based.
Shelter Fundamentals	The course is a basic level course that introduces the guidelines and procedures for setting up, running and closing a shelter during a disaster. Referencing shelter checklist, participants will work on a case study that takes them through four of the six phases of the Sheltering Cycle: Opening, Organizing, Operating, and Closing.
Shelter Fundamentals Exercise	The Shelter Fundamentals Exercise allows participants to practice the knowledge they gained in the Shelter Fundamentals course. It is a "hands-on" skills-based exercise. Participants work in teams that rotate through four skills stations based on the four categories of shelter workers presented in the course: Dormitory, Registration, Information, and Feeding. Prerequisite: Shelter Fundamentals (available online in SABA)
Trailer Tow Team Workshop - Classroom	In this Workshop there will be a classroom presentation of policies and practices of safe trailer transportation and use. Following the class presentation will be a training session on how to hook up a trailer to a tow vehicle, and maneuver and place into unique positions, then safely disconnect. Each person will complete a short driving portion during the workshop. This workshop is recommended for all volunteers interested in towing the Red Cross Trailer for Disasters, Trainings and Events.
Trailer Tow Team Workshop - Skills Test	In this Workshop there will be a classroom presentation of policies and practices of safe trailer transportation and use. Following the class presentation will be a training session on how to hook up a trailer to a tow vehicle, and maneuver and place into unique positions, then safely disconnect. Each person will complete a short driving portion during the workshop. This workshop is recommended for all volunteers interested in towing the Red Cross Trailer for Disasters, Trainings and Events.
